Lou Eichler Award of Excellence

The Lou Eichler Award of Excellence is the highest honor bestowed by NACUMS and is in recognition of a lifetime of achievement in the professional field of college and university mailing services. Named in honor of CUNIMAIL founder Lou Eichler, its first recipient, this award is presented to an individual who has demonstrated the highest levels of professional excellence and who has made contributions above and beyond the scope of their normal duties and responsibilities.

Any candidate considered for this award must have significant accomplishments in college and university mailing that will have an impact on the industry for years to come. Former NACUMS members who are retired, but still made significant contributions to the industry, may be considered. If no qualified candidate is nominated, there will be no award in this category.

The candidate who is considered for this award must meet all the following criteria:

- Have made significant contributions in the college and university mailing industry as a whole beyond the boundaries of the individual's college or university.
- Have proven him or herself to be a leader among college and university mail service managers.
- Have a minimum of 10 years of active involvement in the college and university mailing industry.

Barry began working for the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, in the early 1970's. In 1978, he was asked to head the University's postal operations. Barry has been a long time member of the University Mail Managers Association (UMMA) and a founding member of its original core directing committee. A NACUMS member since 1996, Barry has held multiple terms as an elected director, is currently UMMA's appointed director, and serves as the NACUMS Communications Committee Chair.

Barry has been an intricate part of NACUMS behind the scenes business processes since his appointment to the board in 2001.
